



Key Terms:
Crucial: describes essential range or habitat which has been determined as the determining factor in a population's ability to maintain itself at or above the population objective over the long term.
Winter: animals use this range annually, in substantial numbers (2) along the winter (commonly between 12/1 and 4/30).
Winter Yearlong: animals use habitat within this range on a year-round basis, but there is a significant subset of animals who do not use the winter months (12/1 to 4/30).
Spring/Summer/Fall: animals use this range from the end of the previous winter to the onset of potential winter conditions (commonly 5/1 to 11/30).
