

Winter Wildlife Outing in the Bondurant, WY Area

Please join us for a citizen naturalist expedition into the Bondurant area of Wyoming, to learn about its wildlife values and the challenges they face in this unique area. The Bondurant Corridor—about midway between Jackson and Pinedale, WY, and bisected by Highway 189/191—is a forested plateau between the Wyoming and Gros Ventre Mountain Ranges, and its use has been documented by rare carnivores that include lynx and wolverines.

When: Saturday, January 23, 9:00 am to 4:00 pm

Where: Meet at the Elementary School in Bondurant, Wyoming (14224 US Highway 189/191).

How: Come prepared to spend the day outside in cold, windy weather. Please wear appropriate clothes and sturdy, insulated boots, bring lunch and water, and bring snowshoes if you have them or can rent or borrow them.



This trip is free and open to all with an interest and enthusiasm for wildlife.
